



GIVE500 COLLECTIVE GIVING GRANT 2023 General Information for Grant Seekers

About Give500

Give500 is an initiative of Border Trust, your local Community Foundation. It is a starting point for like-minded individuals and groups to pool their donations, support their community and experience the grant-making process first -hand. Donors are invited to Give500 gatherings and the end of year Pitch Night to hear from the shortlisted applicants and to cast their vote. Every \$500 donated = 1 donor vote. It's a connected and collective way of giving and is about so much more than the money!

The Give500 Grant

The amount of the Give500 grant is determined by the number of donors who contribute each year. 60% of all funds raised are allocated to support important community initiatives with the remaining 40% held in the Give500 Named Sub Fund to build a sustainable foundation, support additional charitable granting and build a perpetual fund for community benefit.

The Give500 2023 Grant is \$18,000 with our two runners-up to take home \$4,000 each.

Applications to the 2023 Give500 grant program will be shortlisted to three outstanding projects by the Give500 Committee, with the successful recipient to be voted by donors at the Pitch Night on 15^h November 2023. The three shortlisted organisations will be offered pitch training, work with Border Trust to prepare a Pitch video and present in-person at the Pitch Night.

- 1. Grant Preparation & Writing Tuesday 1st August, 2023
- 2. Prepare your Pitch Tuesday 22nd August, 2023
- 3. Practice your Pitch Tuesday 26th September, 2023

Give500 Ambassadors

Give500 provides a unique opportunity for donors to have a first-hand introduction to community organisations who work tirelessly to improve the lives of locals. As the number of donors grows, so too does the grant allocation: this is why it is so important for our Give500 grant recipients to become program Ambassadors.

Giving it your all in your video presentation and at the Pitch Night will help donors to better understand and connect with the work you do. Coming along to our 2 annual Give500 2024 gatherings and providing an update on your program, not only builds the campaign for those who follow, but allows donors to *see and feel* that they have been a part of something special.

Give500 is different to our other grant programs, so please read the guidelines before applying.

Aims of the Give500 2023 Grant

The Give500 2023 grant will support **community wellbeing** by providing an \$18,000 grant for a program, event or campaign that:

- Promotes social cohesion, reduce social isolation and connect people to their local community;
- Provides support to community members experiencing disadvantage and distress;
- Promotes healthy living.

Key Dates

- Grant round opens Friday 7th July and closes 12noon Friday 11th August 2023
- Short listed projects will be advised by 15th September 2023
- Video presentations developed with shortlisted organisations by Border Trust 2nd 10th October 2023
- Free Grant Writing & Pitching Workshops 1st August, 22nd August and 26th September 2023
- Pitch & Vote Night Wednesday 15th November 2023
- Projects are funded for a one-year time frame unless otherwise agreed with Border Trust.

To be eligible, your organisation must

- Be a not-for-profit community-based organisation which functions for charitable purposes
- Operate for the benefit of communities within the Albury Wodonga Region, being the LGA's of Albury, Federation, Greater Hume, Indigo, Towong and Wodonga
- Have a registered ABN or Incorporated Association Number
- Meet any other specific eligibility requirements as noted Please Note:
- Organisations with, and without, Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR Item 1) status are invited to apply
- Registration with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (ACNC) is strongly preferred.

What we are most likely to fund

- Activity which has ongoing benefit to the community
- Projects which encourage partnerships
- Projects that clearly identify community support.

What we are less likely to fund

- Capital works
- Ongoing salaries
- Projects in successive years.

What we do not fund

- Recreational or commercial sporting activities
- Projects for private benefit or individuals
- Activities or events that have already taken place
- Please note: The encouragement or advancement of sport, recreation and social activities is not
 considered a charitable activity by the Australian Taxation Office. Therefore, applications from sporting
 organisations need to clearly demonstrate a benefit to the wider community and should indicate which
 other local organisations are involved.

If your organisation is selected to the shortlist

- You will be asked to confirm your capacity to participate in the video production
- Videos will be produced by Border Trust with your nominated representative/s between the 2nd and 10th
 October, 2023
- We'll offer all shortlisted organisations one on one support to help you prepare your Pitch
- The video will be available for your organisation to use following the Pitch Night
- You will be asked to nominate a suitable representative to present in person at the Pitch Night at the Atura, Albury on Wednesday 15th November from 5.30pm



- Border Trust will showcase you, your organisation and your project through the Pitch Night
- We'll provide introductions to potential donors on the night and through social media
- Your organisation will be asked to become a Give500 Ambassador

Successful grant recipients will be required to

- Meet the terms and conditions under the Grant Agreement
- Acknowledge the support from Border Trust and Give500 in all printed material and publicity regarding the funded project, and
- Provide progress reports and a satisfactory acquittal as outlined in the Grant Agreement.

Successful grant recipients will be requested to

- Become a Give500 Ambassador and be available for media and website purposes as requested
- Attend Give500 2024 functions and events to connect donors to your organisation, your project and the Give500 campaign
- Promote and support Border Trust where possible and stay connected with our activities.

Application Process

ALL applications are to be submitted electronically

- Online application form is available on the Border Trust website at https://www.bordertrust.org.au/granting/give500-grant/Give500 Grant – Border Trust
- All questions listed on the Application must be completed
- We recommend preparing your questions in a word document ready to copy and paste into the online application platform (all questions are listed on page 4 below)
- The online application platform enables you to save your content as you move through the document. Note: notifications to your email address from the online platform may automatically go to your junk mail folder. If you have difficulty saving or submitting your online application, check your junk mail folder for instructions from the platform
- The declaration must be acknowledged by the head of the Organisation, being Chief Executive Officer, or equivalent representative

How your application will be considered

- Receipt of your application will be acknowledged via email within 7 days of closing date
- The Give500 Grant Committee will be made up of members of Border Trust and Give500 Donors. They will meet to consider all applications and select a short list of three applicants who will present their projects at the Pitch Night. Donors to the Give500 Collective Giving Campaign will vote on the night for the winning project
- You may be contacted to provide further information prior to the Give500 Grant Committee meeting
- Please note that it is not considered appropriate to lobby members of Border Trust or the Grant Committee personally in relation to your application.

Border Trust and the Give500 campaign will unfortunately not be in a position to fund every application it receives. It is important to state that an unsuccessful application does not reflect the value of the project, and that many very worthwhile projects may not receive funding. Border Trust will be pleased to discuss other options that may be available to you in this regard.

How we will let you know the outcome of your application

All applicants will be notified via email of the outcome of their application by no later than 19 September 2023.
