About the Hume Bank Safer Communities Grant

The purpose of the [Hume Bank Safer Communities Fund](#) is to support local charitable programs and projects that increase community safety. The focus for the 2025 Safer Communities Grant Round will be on community-led solutions that address domestic violence.

Aims of the 2025 Hume Bank Safer Communities Grant

The Safer Communities Fund Grant Program will consider applications from community-based, not-for-profit organisations for projects which address the following impact areas:

- Community Connection + Wellbeing
- Community Equity.

A specific focus of the 2025 grant round is projects or programs that provide community education and prevention strategies, together with initiatives that:

- Assist people experiencing domestic violence
- Assist people to meet their safety needs
- Support domestic violence survivors

For this round, grants up to \$15,000 will be awarded. We welcome conversations about your project to ensure alignment to the Safer Communities Fund grant program.

Key Dates

- Grant program opens 9am 3rd February and closes 9am 10th March 2025
- Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application by no later than mid-May 2025
- Successful recipients will be announced at Border Trust's Annual Showcase event, the Big Give, 15th May 2025
- Grants announcements will be included at the Hume Bank Annual General Meeting on Wednesday 19th November 2025
- Projects are funded for a one-year time frame unless otherwise agreed.

To be eligible, your organisation must

- Be a not-for-profit community-based organisation that functions for charitable purposes
- Operate for the benefit of communities within the Local Government Areas of Albury, Federation, Greater Hume, Indigo, Towong, Wodonga, Wagga Wagga and Wangaratta
- Have a registered ABN or Incorporated Association Number
- Meet any additional eligibility requirements as requested
- Previous applicants are welcome to apply

Please Note:

- Organisations with, and without, Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR Item 1) status are invited to apply
- Registration with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (ACNC) is strongly preferred
- Organisations who received funding in Round 1 2024 are welcome to apply within this round, noting that any subsequent funding may require evidence of a successful acquittal of Round 1 projects as a condition of Round 2 disbursement.

What we are less likely to fund

- Capital works
- Ongoing salaries.

What we do not fund

- Recreational or commercial sporting activities
- Projects for private benefit or individuals
- Retrospective funding for activities or events that have already taken place.
Please note: The encouragement or advancement of sport, recreation and social activities is not considered a charitable activity by the Australian Taxation Office. Therefore, applications from sporting organisations need to clearly demonstrate a benefit to the wider community and should indicate which other local organisations are involved.

Successful grant recipients will be required to

- Meet the terms and conditions under the Grant Agreement
- Acknowledge the support from Border Trust and Hume Bank in all communications and collateral that relates to the funded project, and
- Provide progress reports and a satisfactory acquittal as outlined in the Grant Agreement.

Successful grant recipients will be requested to

- Become a Border Trust Ambassador and be available for media and promotional purposes as mutually agreed
- Attend Border Trust's Big Give Annual Showcase on 15th May 2025
- Attend the Hume Bank Annual General Meeting on 19th November 2025
- Promote and support Border Trust and Hume Bank where possible and stay connected with our activities.

Application Process

- All applications are to be submitted electronically
 - The online application form is available on the Border Trust website at: <https://www.bordertrust.org.au/granting/hume-bank-safer-communities-grant/>
 - All questions listed on the Application must be completed
 - We recommend preparing your answers in a Word document, ready to copy and paste into the online application platform (*all questions are listed on page 4 below*)
 - The online application platform allows you to save your content as you move through the document
- Note: notifications to your email address from the online platform may automatically go to your junk mail folder. If you have difficulty saving or submitting your online application, check your junk mail folder for instructions from the platform*
- The declaration must be acknowledged by the head of the Organisation, such as the Chief Executive Officer, or equivalent representative.

How your application will be considered

- Receipt of your application will be acknowledged via email within 7 days of the closing date
- The 2025 Hume Bank Safer Communities Grant Advisory is made up of members of Border Trust, Hume Bank and community representatives
- The grant advisory assesses all eligible applications and provides recommendations to the Border Trust Board based on this assessment
- You may be contacted to provide further information before or during the grant advisory assessment process
- Please note that it is not considered appropriate to lobby members of Border Trust or the grant advisory about your application.

The Hume Bank Safer Communities Fund will not be able to fund every application it receives. It is important to state that an unsuccessful application does not reflect the value of the project and that very worthwhile projects may not receive funding. Border Trust will be pleased to discuss other options that may be available to you in this regard.
