

Impact area - Climate Resilient Communities

VISION FOR CHANGE: Communities are equipped to anticipate, prepare for, and manage the diverse impacts of a changing climate.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

The impacts of climate change are social, economic, and environmental. Our community needs to be prepared for a hotter, drier future in which all aspects of our lives, including transportation, freight, local economies' access to services, etc., might be adversely impacted.

Investment in climate change adaptation and resilience is often held at a state and federal level. Research shows that localised support delivers better outcomes.

Impact Area - Community Leadership

VISION FOR CHANGE: The development of regional leaders enhances the community's ability to tackle local challenges and opportunities.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Most community leaders see themselves as problem solvers with the energy to act, but they often lack the skills, knowledge, and networks required to be effective leaders.

People must see themselves as having what it takes to be a leader.

Further, small rural and regional communities often rely on the same people to assume leadership roles, which can lead to burnout.

BT has the expertise and connections to deliver investment in locally-led leadership development programs.

BT believes that by developing the skills and knowledge of existing leaders and encouraging new individuals to take up leadership roles, BT will ensure the wellbeing of our community.

BT believes that there are diverse ways of identifying and supporting emerging leaders.

LEVERS FOR CHANGE

Fund opportunities for leaders to develop both soft and hard skills

Fund opportunities for people to participate in existing solutions (volunteering, board membership, advisory board membership etc) to create a pipeline of new leaders

Fund development opportunities and support, including mentoring for aspiring community leaders

Fund opportunities for shared learning and networking

Impact Area - Community Connection and Wellbeing

VISION FOR CHANGE: A welcoming, connected and inclusive community provides the foundation for a vibrant region and positively impacts individual and community well-being.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

There are people in our community who feel isolated. Knowing members of your community and that you are welcome to offer help and ask for support, that someone will check in to see how you are going, is important in any community. In our region, this enables resilience and connection.

All people, with all their diversity, have a right to be included in their community.

BORDER TRUST RESPONSE

BT wants to ensure that wellbeing of our communities is preserved and grows.

BT believes that creating stronger community connections will ensure that our community is able to collaborate, celebrate, and commiserate together and is welcoming and inclusive.

BT believes that it has the expertise to help our communities self-organise and address their challenges by delivering their own solutions.

Impact area - Disaster Recovery, Resilience and Readiness

VISION FOR CHANGE: Our region's ability to prepare for, withstand, and recover from natural disasters enhances the safety, health, and economic prosperity of Border communities.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Our region is heavily impacted by natural disasters such as fire flood and drought on an almost yearly cycle.

The impacts are social, economic, and environmental and have long-lasting consequences.

Investment in disaster preparedness and recovery is often held at a state and federal level. Research shows that localised support delivers better outcomes. Research also shows that communities that are well-prepared have strong social capital and understand the emergency management system and the community's role, are better able to recover.

BORDER TRUST RESPONSE

BT believes that secure access to shelter, food, transport, and healthcare are fundamental preconditions for people's engagement in education, employment, and social networks.

Enabling people to have basic dignity strengthens the social fabric of our community.

LEVERS FOR CHANGE

Fund material aid/equipment or resources for organisations working to reduce food & housing insecurity

Fund programs that support acquisition of basic skills such as English language and driving

Fund resources that allow people to effectively engage with learning and healthcare

Fund development opportunities and support, including mentoring

Fund opportunities for people to become employment ready

Fund opportunities for our community to come together
